# Dual Enrollment AB 288 - College and Career Access Pathways Act

# What is AB 288?

- Assembly Bill 288 (2015) establishes the "College and Career Access Pathways Act" which
  - Authorizes California Community College districts to enter into formal partnership agreements with local K-12 districts
- "Dual Enrollment" is identified in AB 288 to define "special part-time" or "special full-time" students.

high school or other eligible special admit students enrolling in community college credit courses.

• AB 288 is an option, not a mandate.

#### **Students Served Under AB 288**

- AB 288 expands dual enrollment for students who may not already be college bound and/or are an underrepresented population.
- Prior to AB 288, efforts focused on students who were deemed "college ready."
- Focuses on a pathway-driven/cohort model (as opposed to individual courses).
- 2017-18 at PGHS: Computer Information Systems (CSIS). Available to all PGUSD students.
  - CSIS 75: Intro to Computer Hardware/IT Essentials
  - CSIS 76: Networking Fundamentals/Intro to Networking

#### **AB288 Partnership Agreement**

- Dual enrollment courses offered under AB 288 partnerships are required to have an "AB 288 College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) Partnership Agreement" which
  - Outlines the specific terms of their partnership and pathways included.
  - Must be between two district governing boards.
  - Must be presented to each district's board twice -once as an information/discussion item and once at a subsequent meeting for public comment and voting.

#### **Course/Curriculum Requirements**

- Community College courses with college-level units and placed on permanent transcript.
- Adherence to the official Community College course outline of record is required.
- Faculty teaching dual enrollment courses must meet applicable California Community College (CCC) minimum qualifications as established by the CCC Chancellor's Office.

#### **Student Services**

- Community Colleges are required to provide access to adequate student support services (regardless of location or means of delivery), including:
  - Orientation
  - Assessment
  - Counseling (Advising & Education Plans)
  - Follow-up services
  - Additional program support and services
    - Accessibility Support
    - Library Resources
    - Learning Support

## **Scheduling Considerations**

- Community college districts may claim state apportionment for courses given through AB 288
- Required minutes does require additional instructional time
  - 50 minutes on A/D Days (Currently 48 minutes)
  - 3 units courses (CSIS 75) require 9 additional minutes to block (2:54 release)
  - 4 unit courses (CSIS 76) require 26 additional minutes to block (3:09 release)
  - Course Scheduled for 6<sup>th</sup> Period to accommodate time additions
