II. ACTION/DISCUSSION

A. Facilities Use Fee Schedule Review

<u>Trustee Paff</u> noted he was not present at the last Board meeting when this item was previously discussed but that he was provided a copy of the audio from that Board meeting, which is available to the public upon request.

Assistant Superintendent Rick Miller explained to the Board that there was a request by the WAVE Program to reduce the facilities use fees, the Board requested Assistant Superintendent Miller to look into the fee structure, determine the estimated hard costs for this particular group, and establish actual costs that include custodial services, water, electrical and chemical needs for maintaining the facilities for the three (3) week period reserved for this non-profit organization. The estimated hard costs were determined to be roughly over \$4,000 for custodial services and over \$3,000 for additional costs such as water, electrical, chemicals, etc.

The Board discussed this item and received public comment.

The following people spoke during public comment in support of reducing or waiving entirely the facilities use fees for the WAVE Program, noting the benefit of the program to Pacific Grove children and the community as a whole.
