RE: Safety Protocol Directives

Dear Administrators,

Please read and direct your site staff to immediately implement the following safety directives, unless noted differently below:

- All employees must wear and visibly display a current PGUSD ID badge at all times while on school properties
- During school hours all employees are required to intercept any adult on any district property without visible identification and, with courtesy and insistence, direct them back to the front office/reception for sign-in
- District and site office staff members shall endeavor to greet any visitor at the front office immediately upon their entrance, and at least, acknowledge that service will be promptly provided
- Any District employee who notices a student or other adult in physical or emotional distress are directed to make contact and provide the support necessary to assist that individual, or to call for assistance
- Unless a member of the office staff readily recognizes the individual, any person requesting to sign-out a student must present a valid form of ID and be noted on the student release form (implemented April 2, please send advisory to your school families- District will also send a message prior to April 2)
