External Clubs

- PGHS and PGUSD provide no direct financial support.
 - Uniforms on their own
 - Equipment on their own
- We charge for facilities
- There is no faculty sponsorship
- PGHS provides no logistics support in scheduling or transportation.
- Students may not leave school for events (unexcused if for this only).
- Third party insurance

Internal Clubs

- PGHS and PGUSD usually provide no direct financial support.
 - Uniforms on their own
 - Equipment may be provided.
 - These clubs often will do fund raising on and off campus and must keep their funds in the ASB account managed by Felicia. The Site Council may allocate funding which is rare. For example, the Natural High Club received funding for several years to put on activities for the club which was open to all students.
- We provide use of facilities (Facilitron allows no fee, priority use for students)
- There must be faculty sponsorship
- PGHS / PGUSD may provide some logistics support, but no game scheduling (done by sponsor), typically no transport.
- Students leaving for events may be considered 'excused' as per any sporting / music / mock trial etc (normally sponsored) event.
- PGHS/PGUSD insurance

Central Coast Section (CCS) sports teams

- PGHS and PGUSD provides some direct financial support in the form of coach stipends and transportation
- There is no funding specific toward uniforms or equipment. The Breakers Club has supplied funding for each team and each coach then uses the funds along with any fundraising done to purchase equipment, uniforms, etc. Some teams have received more funding based on the needs. Special situations have been handled through requests directly to the Breakers Club. We provide use of facilities (Facilitron allows no fee, priority use for students)
- There must be faculty sponsorship
- PGHS / PGUSD provide logistics support, game scheduling, and transportation.
- Students leaving for events are considered 'excused'.
- PGHS/PGUSD insurance

Funding

Be aware that athletics has three sources of funding: Breakers Club, individual team fundraising, and ticket sales at football, volleyball, and basketball games. Breakers Club and fundraising go to the specific team for uses decided upon by the coach and approved by Athletic Director and administration. Breakers Club usually donates \$10,000 each year. **Ticket sales** pay for officials (approx. \$70/official/game: two per game for water polo so it would be approx. \$140 per level per gender. If we had JV and Var. and girls and boys, it would be approx. \$280 a couple of times per week (boys and girls would alternate sites) as both could not have a home match on the same day.) Funding would come out of existing ticket sales. **Ticket sales** also pays for league, section and state fees as I note in the Board packet. It also pays for fees from the company that schedules officials.
