How We Learn

Embeds Spanish into daily lessons, where children (ages 3-4) acquire second language skills in a natural way through games, movement, music and thematic play. 70% Spanish 30%English

The Co-Op Model

Parents attend monthly instructor-led parent education classes and participate in class weekly: Parents learn while teaching their children to ensure that all of our preschool children are Kindergarten ready.

Goal

Our goal is to provide parents the education and support they need to help their children be academically and socially/emotionally successful in school. We build a foundation in Spanish language for children to facilitate and encourage their acquired language through their k-12 education and beyond.

Elementary Spanish Language goals

To Introduce and teach language skills in a fun interactive stress free environment where the students can learn to appreciate the language, the culture and its people.

Curriculum

A combination of resources are used to create a comprehensive age appropriate 100% immersion curriculum that consists of introductory vocabulary, songs, dances, cultural crafts, games, hands-on-activities and cooking projects. In addition, community building activities are used in a daily basis to build motivation and relationships.

Rockalingua website program

Rockalingua is used as part of the curriculum in the classroom and as an at home practice resource for kids and families.

What we are learning

Introductions, the calendar, numbers 0-31, birthday song, days of the week, weather, butterfly life cycle and body parts, feelings, stories, songs and games.

Overall:

The students have responded very well to the program. They are eager and happy to learn Spanish. They are beginning to take more risks and use their acquired communication skills outside the Spanish class.

Total Physical Response

Students are being taught with an emphasis on TPR strategies. Learners learn gestures to associate vocabulary and make meaning. This allows the class to be taught in the Target Language at least 90% of the time.

Curriculum

Voces digital is the curriculum at PGMS.

conversational activities to improve
competency. Cultural topics are also
covered which allow students to engage
with the target cultures.

Themes we have studied so far in Spanish class:

Introductions, high frequency vocabulary, numbers, adjectives, stories, classroom vocabulary, The Super Seven, cognates, formal and informal language, Hispanic Heritage month.


Overall:

What We're Learning

Spanish 1; greetings, simple conversations (origins, age, feelings), stories, recordings, art, games Hispanic Heritage Month;
Spanish 2 and 3: Stories, past tense, recordings, art, dance, games, music;
AP Spanish/Span 4: Stories, oral recordings and written summaries, food, dance, culture.

Pilot & Curriculum Review

We are currently piloting <u>Voces</u>, an online Comprehensible Input textbook. We are also reviewing other curriculi.

PLC Collaboration

Teachers meet Thursdays for 40 mins to align curriculum and discuss best T&L practices. We are also aligning grading practices to grade for equity in our PLC. MS & HS teachers meet monthly to discuss vertical alignment of piloted curriculum.

Spanish for Heritage Speakers

To improve literacy & communication, stakeholders are studying district data to offer dual enrollment Spanish for Heritage Speaker classes at PGHS. Students qualify through assessment.
